



Step 1: Measuring & ordering

To establish how much lawn you will need, measure the length and the width of the area you want to lay your new lawn then multiply these two figures together. For irregular sites divide into smaller squares or triangles, calculate each individual area then add together.

Each slab of lawn is approx. $0.5m^2$, measuring $1200mm \times 400mm$, $40m^2$ of lawn will weigh

approx. 1 tonne. When transporting the larger orders you will need a tandem trailer with brakes, or a 1 tonne ute. You can not carry more than 30m^2 on any trailer without brakes.

Deliveries of fresh cut lawn will be delivered to selected stores every weekend until sold out.



Step 2: Site preparation

The amount of preparation will vary from site to site, but remember the more time and effort that is put into your site preparation, the better your end result will be.

Do not lay lawn on top of existing lawn or weeds, remove with Round Up. Remove all desiccated grass and weeds. Cultivate (loosen) your soil to a depth of 100mm using a rotary hoe or pitch fork, you may need to bring in more topsoil from

a sand & soil yard. Your prepared area should sit 30mm lower than your paths, driveways etc. This will allow for the lawn to sit flush with your paths or paving.

Using a rake or a straight piece of timber, level your soil, to achieve your final levels spend some extra time to ensure you have an even surface, this will give you a better end result and a more even mowing surface.



Step 3: Laying

Your lawn will need to be laid the day you receive it to prevent the roots from drying out.

Before laying your lawn ensure that the soil is moist. Spread fertiliser evenly over the prepared area. Start laying your lawn along a straight edge e.g. driveway. Stagger the joins in a brick-like pattern. If laying on a slope lay across rather than down the slope, you may need pegs to hold your

lawn in place until the roots have established. Use a sharp knife or a shovel to shape lawn.

Once the lawn has been laid we recommend watering well and rolling the lawn with a water filled or concrete roller, this will connect the roots with the soil.















Step 4: Watering

Water your lawn immediately after laying, for the next 2-3 weeks water 2-3 times a day until the roots have established.

Water in a methodical fashion ensuring that each square metre has been watered evenly. The soil under your new lawn must be kept damp until the roots of the lawn have established. Depending on the time of year you lay your lawn establishment

time can vary from 2-3 weeks to 5-6 weeks. If watering with sub surface irrigation you must water from above until the lawn has established. You will know when the lawn has established by gently pulling back one corner, when you can no longer lift off the ground your lawn has set root and is established.



Step 5: Mowing

Do not mow your lawn until the roots have fully established.

We recommend you mow your lawn 3-4 weeks after laying. For your first mow just take the tips off and remember whenever mowing never take off more than one third of the leaf blade. Mowing can take place every 7 to 14 days during Spring and Summer. During Autumn and Winter about every 2 to 5 weeks or as required.

Step 6: Fertilising

For the best results fertilise your lawn 6-8 weeks after laying, ensuring you follow the instructions on the packet and water in well.

To keep your lawn looking its best fertilise at least once in September, December, March and once in early May.
