Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures

Accidental release: Minor spills do not normally need any special cleanup measures. In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or watercourses. As a minimum wear overalls, goggles and gloves. High risk of slipping due to nature of material. Stop leak if safe to do so and contain spill. Absorb onto sand, vermiculite, or other suitable absorbent material. Sweep up and shovel or collect recoverable product into labelled containers for recycling or salvage. After spills, wash area, preventing runoff from entering drains. If a significant quantity of material enters drains, advise emergency services.

Section 7 - Handling and Storage

Handling: Keep exposure to this product to a minimum, and minimise the quantities kept in work areas.
